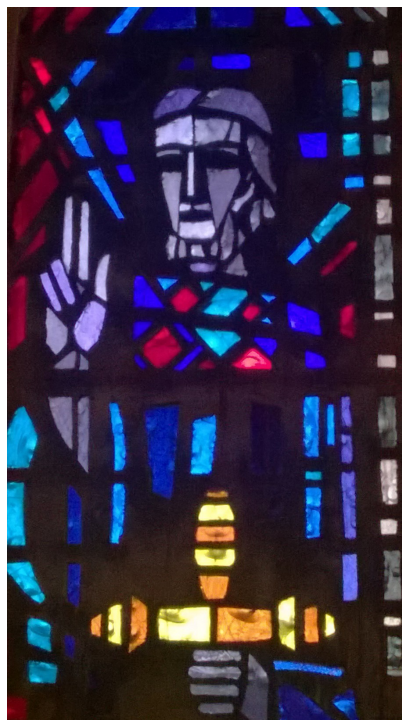

Archbishop Tartaglia's visit: some thoughts from the Parish Priest:
