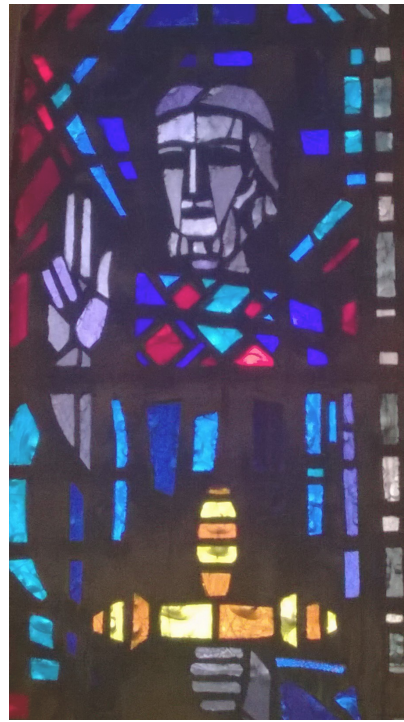

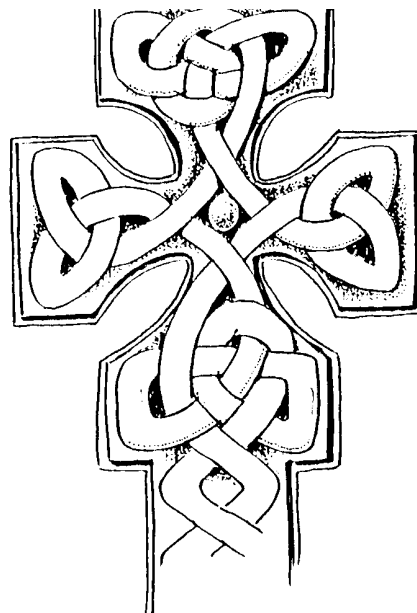

We continue to improve our physical appearance, you may notice the external lights on the outside Church wall have disappeared—they are being renovated and will reappear with low power inexpensive LED bulbs on light/dark and timers so that they will automatically come on when it gets dark and go off when it is light but also go off in the wee small hours and come back on when people begin moving around again.

The insulation work done in the house will require to be repainted and I intend to have that done once the electrical works have been completed. Likewise, the upstairs in the house requires to be finished as the walls are bare plaster and the floorboards uncovered. This should be the last stage of the renovations undertaken on the house.

As for the church, the cleaning up of the porch area will begin on Monday 10th November and be complete before the Archbishop arrives (DV).

A friendly electrical company are going to renew the sanctuary lights, also using LED lights which use a fraction of the power we currently use—the equivalent of a bar on your electric fire per bulb!! These new lights will be much brighter and will use less than a tenth of the electricity. The costs of this will be held by the company on a no interest basis until the parish is in a better financial position, namely after the bank loan is paid off. We can pay the bill when we are ready even if that is a number of years away. Hopefully that too will be done before the Archbishop visits depending on the delivery of the materials.
