

We continue to improve our physical appearance, you may notice the external lights on the outside Church wall have returned—they have been renovated and have low power inexpensive LED bulbs.

As for the church, the cleaning up of the porch area will begin tomorrow and be complete before the Archbishop arrives (DV).

Unfortunately the sanctuary light fittings cannot be delivered before 10th December, so they will not be in place before the Archbishop visits, but they will be there for Christmas.

Some physical rearrangements have taken place on the sanctuary, in accord with the regulations for Mass, the candles may be on or near the altar. The move off the altar to surround it is to highlight the altar and make it more clearly the focal point of the sanctuary. This is the arrangement we used when Pope Benedict celebrated Mass Bellahouston. Likewise the Lectionary now faces the people when it is not being read from and so visitors to the church may come and read the scriptures of the day at any time of the day.
